Did you know? The Oneida Sheraton flatware pattern included here has been around since 1981. Oneida has been around for much longer. The company grew out of the original Oneida Community founded in upstate New York by John Humphrey Noyes in 1848. This communal society was founded on the principles of individual self-perfection and shared property. Products made by the Oneida Community included animal traps, silk, chains, and, eventually, some of the world's most recognizable flatware. During World War I and World War II, Oneida became a supplier for the U.S. military, producing ammunition clips, combat knives, surgical instruments, and silverware for the Army and Navy. When stainless steel was introduced to the market in the early 20th century, it failed to make an immediate impression on the flatware industry. Taking a chance, Oneida decided to shift its focus from sterling to stainless. Strong research and development greatly improved the quality of stainless steel as a dinnerware material, helping Oneida achieve the sort of success that continues today.
